
For those in need, [especially	,] that setting their fears aside, they
would recognize our Lord's care for all	who are perishing; for peace to calm our troubled


consciences; and that God would not reject our prayers for their faithlessness, but teach us to trust fully in Him, let us pray to the Lord: **Lord, have mercy.**




