C hear our prayer.

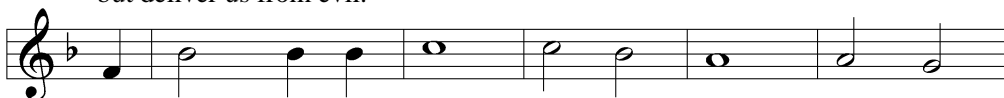
